School Mission

- 1. We aim at providing students with a happy, harmonious and positive learning environment conducive to moral, academic, physical, social, personal and artistic development.
- 2. We nurture students with solid foundation for further studies and better career development.
- 3. We promote students' language proficiency in English, Chinese and Putonghua and skills in Information Technology.
- 4. We help students build up confidence, thinking skills, analytical skills and perpetual learning ability in order to better prepare them for the challenges in the 21st century.
- 5. We promote all round education in students' moral, intellectual, physical, social and aesthetic development.

* Note:

As discussed with the Po Leung Kuk School Board, a community college is being operated at Po Leung Kuk Vicwood K.T. Chong Sixth Form College (保良局莊啓程預科書院); and a new community college will be jointly operated by the HK University and Po Leung Kuk in Causeway Bay. Thus, in the year 03-08, operating a Community College is no longer the school mission of Po Leung Kuk Ngan Po Ling College as stipulated in the school proposal submitted to the Education and Manpower Bureau in the Year 2001.

SWOT Analysis

- 1. Strengths
 - The school has an effective and efficient management team. All members are experienced professionals who share a common vision to provide students with high quality education. They can effectively plan and implement school programmes related to development and quickly respond to any measures to enhance the quality of education. They are able to set up a role model and effectively lead and support their subordinates to implement the school's mission and vision.
 - Teachers are energetic and enthusiastic. They are able to incorporate the modern educational theories and technologies to the whole-person development of students. They are cooperative and eager to share their teaching methods and resources.
 - The school endeavours to enhance students' bilingual and trilingual proficiency, to prepare them for further studies and career development.
 - All teachers and staff can participate in formulating school policies and they have a strong sense of belonging to the school.
 - The school has implemented a school-based evaluation system in order to enhance the quality of teaching and learning.
 - The use of English as the medium of instruction starting from junior forms is widely accepted by parents.
 - The school has the new millennium design which provides students with an effective learning environment. Each classroom is equipped with a computer and a LCD projector for IT teaching.
 - Teachers have a good communication with parents and can effectively care for students' personal growth.

2. Weaknesses

- The school is developing at a high pace. Although most of the outcomes are satisfactory, there is room for improvement.
- Learning abilities among students vary and this increases the difficulty in catering for individual needs.
- Students lack initiative to learn. They often rely on their teachers to guide them in the process.
- Students do not often speak English and Putonghua outside classrooms. More strategic policies should be implemented to encourage them to speak English and Putonghua.
- 3. Opportunities
 - The school has planned to build a 3-storey annex which comprises an indoor swimming pool, a number of classrooms and multi-purpose rooms inside the school campus. This can develop students' potential in swimming and provide more rooms for small class teaching.
 - The school is planning a school-based project learning curriculum to be implemented in S.1 (2004-2005) onwards so that students can effectively acquire the project skills.

- The school will join the School Development Project (2004-2005) organized by the Chinese University of Hong Kong. This external review together with the school self-evaluation will enhance school development and accountability.
- The establishment of the Parent-Teacher Association will encourage parents to actively participate in school management.
- 4. Threats
 - The school is situated in Kowloon City. There are many reputable schools and the competition is keen.
 - The overall decreasing birth rate in Hong Kong will increase the difficulty of student recruitment.
 - Students' values and attitudes are greatly affected by the society of Hong Kong.
